ABOUT THE EVENT

Digital tools allow for an unprecedented inclusion of citizens in all areas of public action, with the potential to improve the quality of democracy and governance through greater participation and citizen-centric policymaking. Governments, however, have taken radically different approaches across Europe, either facilitating or hindering eDemocracy. As a result, citizens and civic groups, seeing their role as true contributors are increasingly using online tools for informal participation and governance scrutiny.

The aim of the workshop is to identify and assess trends and good practices of eParticipation across the European Union, with a focus on informal citizens-led eDemocracy projects. Participants are encouraged to bring in own experiences, either led by their organisation or put in place in their country, Participants will deepen their knowledge on formal and informal means of citizen participation and formulate recommendations for the future. By participating in the European Youth Event afterwards, their will, among others, have the chance to discuss them with young Europeans from other parties and NGOs.

Possible guiding questions:

- > What are your ideas and expectations on eDemocracy and eParticipation?
- > Have you already used (in)formal means of eParticipation?
- > How is eParticipation linked to your life, your daily work?
- > To what extent is eDemocracy and eParticipation relevant for your organisation?
- > Would you like to see a broader citizen's participation in policy-making ?

Part II: Assessment

The results of the brainstorming will be assessed depending on different criteria (interaction, relation citizens-institution, citizens' input, binding character, initiator, policy level, etc.). The focus lies on interactivity and e-participation, using digital means such as smartphones and tablets for assessment and a visual presentation of the results.

Part III: Formulating ideas

Once current trends and good practices for eParticipation have been identified and their impact assessed, participants are invited to develop strategies and recommendations in teams of three on how to foster the implementation and use of informal means of eParticipation. This includes raising awareness for the possibilities of civic empowerment, inclusion, and state scrutiny through digital means. The ideas will feed into the policy-brief after the workshop which will be sent to all and workshop participants and relevant stakeholders.

Part IV: Wrap-Up and Outlook

Main take-aways form the workshop and outlook on possibility to contribute to the policybrief or write a blog post about the workshop and its main conclusions or central questions.
