#### **ABOUT THE EVENT**

Embracing digitalisation is embracing the improvement of our lives, societies, workplaces and schools. However, it is not just an end in itself. The European Institutions are also paying great attention to digitalisation as a tool to create value. This is vital for our economy, our society and a "greener" future. Many unknowns remain as to how to achieve this process in a fair and ambitious manner, but what is certain is that choices must be made cohesively across the EU and in the Member States.

This Expert Forum will emphasize the importance of certain key topics related to the aforementioned processes:

- Digitalisation: is a fundamental process in several respects. The Digital Economy and Society
  Index of the European Commission show some inconsistencies in the digitalisation processes
  within Europe. While some differences still exist between countries in how digital processes
  are integrated into society, education, internal market and in adding value to business, the IoT,
  5G and AI can be the keys to the future of the digitalisation process.
- Connectivity: equal access to the web in an interconnected world can determine the success of the economy of a country, while the use of social media changed the way people communicate on a day by day basis. In the next 10 years, equal access to the network throughout Europe will be essential, while digital IDs and privacy concerns will need further regulatory steps. As per the liberal adage, "what worries you, masters you" citizens should be empowered to master their own digital lives.
- *E-commerce*: a logical consequence of digital processes is the implementation of a market linked to them. Since the first online transaction back in 1994, the online sale of any product has grown exponentially in recent years and will reach the stratospheric figure of over 6 trillion dollars in 2022. E-commerce probably saved our economy during lockdown and the pandemic; how can it be implemented in the future?
